Shall Linn County enact the Law Enforcement Levy at \$3.08 per \$1,000 beginning in 2022 for four years for operations? This measure may cause property taxes to increase more than three percent.

**Summary** 175 words which concisely and impartially summarizes the measure and its major effect.

APPROVING THIS FOUR YEAR LOCAL OPTION SERIAL LEVY WOULD IMPOSE THE LAW ENFORCEMENT LEVY THROUGH JUNE 2026. The levy would begin July 1, 2022, at \$3.08 per \$1,000 assessed value tax rate and provide continued funding for Linn County's law enforcement work for an additional four years. This levy would maintain public safety services with all revenues continuing to fund (in the percentages shown) the operations of the Sheriff's Office (76%), criminal prosecution (10%), plus juvenile offender supervision and detention (14%).

This four year levy would produce, at a tax rate of \$3.08 per \$1,000 assessed value, an estimated total of \$147,992,336.00 from the following estimated annual authorizations to levy: \$35,632,636.00 in 2022; \$36,434,371.00 in 2023; \$37,407,168.00 in 2024; and \$38,518,161.00 in 2025.

A "YES" VOTE APPROVES LINN COUNTY'S LAW ENFORCEMENT LEVY.

The estimated tax cost for this measure is an ESTIMATE ONLY based on the best information available from the county assessor at the time of estimate and may reflect the impact of early payment discounts, compression and the collection rate.
